At the September meeting I showed slides and told the story of my Pony Express road trip out West via Shelby Mustang, this past May and June. I drove as far as Boulder, Colorado and back, covering 4,497 miles in 18 days and travelling through 13 states. Overall gas mileage was 22.1, not bad for a 2011 GT 500 with a supercharged 5.4 liter V-8 putting out 550 horsepower.

Although not yet an antique, the Shelby took me to The Henry Ford Museum, Greenfield Village, the Rouge Assembly Plant, the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum, the Early Ford V-8 Foundation Museum, and the Gilmore Museum, housing hundreds of wonderful antiques and classics.

I also got to ride in a 1918 Model T, a 1968 Lincoln Continental Convertible and a 1930 Model A station wagon.

Non-car highlights of the trip included performing Taps at the Gettysburg National Cemetery, visiting the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, The Badlands and Mt. Rushmore. And the Spam Museum (no kidding) in Austin, Indiana. They do have a WW II Jeep. It was great to get out in the open spaces and open roads of this big, beautiful country.
